

# Number of convicted individuals is less by 2,692 i.e. by 27,9 %




#### Number of convicts sentenced to the deprivation of liberty is less by 1,086 individuals i.e. by 26,9 %




Deprivation of liberty

### Share of non-custodial sentences is 57,6 %





#### Sentences passed in 6 months of 2012







### Application of preventive measures has decreased by 795


## Preventive measures applied in 6 months of 2012:


Compared to 2011, sentencing to imprisonment was reduced by 7 per cent

# Referral to courts is increasing every year




375 more administrative cases (7,9 %) in 2012
